

A2 Key for Schools

A *Key for Schools* qualification shows that a student can use English to communicate in simple situations. It's a logical next step after [Young Learners](#) and a good place for older children to start learning English too.

The exam gives students the confidence to go on to study for higher-level English exams, such as [Preliminary for Schools](#).

Key for Schools is targeted at the same [CEFR level](#) as [Key for schools](#), but with content aimed at school-age learners rather than adults.

Exam Format

Key for Schools is made up of three papers developed to test your English skills: **Reading and Writing** (1 hour 10 minutes), **Listening** (30 minutes, including 8 minutes' transfer time), **Speaking** (8–10 minutes per pair of candidates).

Key for Schools results are reported on the [Cambridge English Scale](#).

You will receive a separate score for each skill, giving you a clear understanding of your performance. These scores are averaged to give you an overall result for the exam. You will also be given a grade and Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) level.
